

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

In good faith, garden members agree to help Good Earth Community Garden in any capacity they are able in addition to maintaining their assigned plot. The goal would be 4 hours of volunteering a monthly or equivalent. If you have a special skill or talent, please let us know. If you have ideas or other suggestions not found on this list, please let us know. Work Opportunities will be posted in the shed.

1. **Weeding/Watering** (Sign up is required to water designated areas)
 - Weed regularly around the *outside* of your plot, fence lines inside and outside the garden perimeter, 8th Street pathway up to garden and the bank.
 - Water designated area: Front flower bed/blueberries/artichokes, under sign, along west outside fence, herb garden, 8th street top and bank.
2. **Work Parties**. Work an amount of time helping with the assigned project, or provide drinks and/or treats.
3. **Assist with Composting**. Turning or moving compost piles *under the direction of a board member*.
4. **Shed Clean-up**. Sweep, straighten, organize, clean buckets and tools.
5. **Attendance at Board Meetings**. Board Meetings are the 2nd Monday of every month at 6:30 p.m., at the Bandon Youth Center at 101 11th Street.
6. **Join a Planning Committees** (To be Emailed/Posted in the Shed as needed)
7. **Fund Raising**.
 - Help with the Annual Plant Sale.
 - Sell Gloves at events.
8. **Help with Cranberry Festival Parade** the second Saturday of September. Join the planning committee, participate in the parade.
9. **Help with Spring and/or Fall Social**. Join the planning committee, set-up, decorate, clean-up, provide drinks or treats.
10. **Education**. Help with yearly Garden Series Classes: set-up, Meet & Greet, clean-up, or teach a class, or recruit someone to teach.
11. **Help with Social Media/Facebook/Website** management. Help provide posts, take pictures, write a news release for Facebook and work with webmaster to update/maintain the website.
12. **Donations** (*Suggested minimum donation \$5.00*) **for the following**:
 - Compost Fund, Soil amendments (fertilizer, nematodes, fish waste, manure)
 - Straw
 - Tools (as needed, this will be posted in shed)
 - Donations of plant cuttings, bulbs or tubers from your yard or house plants for the annual plant sale. Cuttings will be collected a few months before the sale, as well as at end of season to winter in the Greenhouse for the next year's sale.
 - Donate harvested produce from your plot.
